PHERCLOS programs "Transnational Education Mentoring Partnerships" and "Local Educational Clusters" are taking place in 15 countries over the world, developing and implementing various projects and pilot activities.

Activities within the PHERCLOS project in the context and implementation of Local Educational Clusters (LECs). They are intended as communities of practice and incubators of change in local education ecosystems based on Open Schooling and Science Capital.

A total of 6 LECs are implemented during the PHERCLOS project. They are located in Vienna (Austria), Kielce (Poland), Porto (Portugal), Trieste (Italy), and Medellín (Colombia).

The Transnational Education Mentoring Partnership (TEM) program provides an opportunity to realize cross-state initiatives related to Open Schooling and mutual learning among learning partners. 13 TEM partnerships were selected for the program, formed from 32 different institutions in 16 countries, including universities, charitable organizations, universities, children's universities, and schools operating in different countries and cultural environments.

GUIDELINES

- The SciChallenge contest is aiming at **young people**, who are either between **10 to 14 years** or **15 to 20 years old** (pre-university only).
- Single individuals or groups** that include a maximum three persons can participate in the contest.
- Participation is open to residents of a Member State of the **European Union & Associated Countries**.
- The topic of your application has to cover one of the following fields: **Natural Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics**.
- The topics for contributions can be based on one of the **SciChallenge 50 topic sheets**.
- Alternatively, participants choose an alternative **STEM-topic** (Open STEM-Category).
- Applications can be done in different formats (**Poster, Presentation or Video**).
- The contributions have to be uploaded on **Slideshare** or **YouTube**.

TOOLKITS

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE SCICHALLENGE CONTEST?

The SciChallenge contest is aiming at young people, who are interested in **NATURAL SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING or MATHEMATICS**. If you are either between 10 to 14 years (Age Group 1) OR 15 to 20 years old (Age Group 2), you can participate in the contest. You can choose between participating alone, or you can work together with one or two of your friends or schoolmates. A group is limited to three persons.

Limitations for Age Group 1: If you are younger than 14 years old, you have to inform your parents or your legal guardian about your participation and get their approval, when you are registering for the contest.

Limitations for Age Group 2: If you are already enrolled at a university, you cannot participate in SciChallenge.

WHAT DO I HAVE TO DO?

A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

Step 1: Let your imagination run free!

Step 2: Choose a topic from one of the 50 topic sheets or select an Open STEM-topic

Step 3: Always keep in mind that the selected topic has to be approached from one of the following fields: Natural Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics.

Step 4: Discuss your participation with your parents or your teacher

Step 5: Prepare a POSTER, a VIDEO or a PRESENTATION

Step 6: Upload it to Slideshare or YouTube between the 1st of January and 15th of May 2017 and include the #scichallenge2017 in the title and description

Step 7: Register for the contest on www.scichallenge.eu and submit your contribution

Step 8: Show it to your friends and motivate them to participate in SciChallenge

Step 9: Gather as many likes, views and reactions as possible

Step 10: With a bit of luck you will be selected as one of the 12 pan-European winners, who win a trip to Vienna as well as additional prizes

Step 11: Participate at the big Award Ceremony and present your work in front of an international audience!

Distribution of the submitted projects according to residence country of the participants.




Age Group/Gender


Media Format Distribution

The central idea of the project is that support will be coordinated to groups of SMEs, e.g. related to industrial areas or business parks, and provided through an organisation or actor that is already known and trusted by the SMEs.

Together with the methodology, the GEAR@SME project has developed a set of tools to support Trusted Partners and companies in the challenge of improving energy efficiency.

The INDUCE project will develop an open access platform (INDUCE toolkit) where training material, online lessons, guidelines and tools will be available for companies aiming to increase their energy efficiency. INDUCE will implement this methodology in 15 pilot and 300 target companies from the R&D and agro-food sector, which will allow a behaviour change in up to 3,535 employees and the implementation of at least 400 effective energy efficiency measures, thus leveraging a potential for energy savings of about 106 GWh/year.

Person Localization

The risk of developing mental illnesses such as dementia increases steadily with increasing age. Affected people often feel the urge to run away or get lost. Person Localization devise are devices which can be used indoors or outdoors, depending on the habits of the person who is about to wander. With their help the eloped or wandering person can be found within short time.

Description

There are several reasons why older adults develop tendencies to run away or to run to certain places. For example, they only want to go for a walk or are dissatisfied with their stay in a care facility - but in combination with diseases such as dementia, where the risk of disease increases with age, these simple activities can be very dangerous for the patient. At an advanced stage, dementia patients tend to walk to certain places they can still remember. However, in many cases the limited cognitive abilities and disorientation associated with the disease are the reason why older adults get lost. Also, closely related to the diminishing cognitive abilities is the disorder of the sense of orientation, which can lead to the loss of the sense of space and time. As a result, those affected may not know where they are and may not be able to handle time data. For example, a dementia sufferer can hardly begin anything with the statement that he should wait 10 minutes and will probably forget it in a very short time. In dementia, however, disorientation is associated with fragments of memory, which can lead to patients going to work or picking up their children from school, for example. Since they do not know that these are past memories and former commitments, it could be very difficult to dissuade them from their plans. In addition, running away can also be very dangerous for mentally handicapped people. For instance, when they leave the house they do not think about putting on shoes or a jacket in winter, they often cannot find their way back or are careless when crossing the streets. Consequently, running away can lead to injury or, in the worst case, even death.

OBJECTIVES AND TARGETS

The stock of motorcycles in Austria has increased by 50% in the last 5 years and reached a new peak. At the same time, the number of motorcycle accidents has increased by 20% in the same period. The number of accidents selected at the 2010 level (in the previous road) is nevertheless developed significantly to the total number of accidents. The number of accidents per 100,000 inhabitants is 1.2 times higher than the EU average and the average age at a high level. In 2010, 40 motorcycle were killed in Austria road. Almost a third of the fatalities were due to the motorcycle. The main causes of motorcycle accidents are the lack of knowledge of the capabilities and potential dangers.

Strategic Group: Transport, Austria provides a solid basis for action. The motorcycle is a mode of transport that knowledge should be more easily available for bikers and drivers. The need for the development of a system to select, analyze and visualize data from the road is a priority. The project SPOT+RIDE is a new approach to the existing in Austria.




